- GSR Q & A Discussion Session- No Discussion
- 2024 Proposed Budget Discussion & Process- Gene went over proposed 2024 budget. Committees were to present their requested budgets in writing. Received budgets from Treatment and Meeting List Chairs. Gene will bring the requested budgets to the meeting in Sept. Will have money left over from this years budget due to expenses being down. Gene tentatively put a \$4,000 budget in for 2024. Positive things going to happen because District has secured bids to host two Assemblies back to back. Only sending our DCM's to one Assembly next year we are going to have a \$600 expense opposed to a \$1800 expense. Groups are going to have more funds to be able to support Central Office due to scaling down number of Assemblies GSR's are being sent to. Gene properly budgeted to send DCM's to events with what the Procedure Guide states for expenses. Treatment requested \$200, Alano Club Rent \$300, PO Box Annually \$150, Bank Checks \$50, Workshops \$300, Zoom \$200. Gene would like to combine Events and Delegate Report on the budget because Event Chair is covering that, eliminating the Delegate line item. Events Chair will have a budget to take care of all events. Committee voices: Archives- Absent, Grapevine- Open, Meeting List- Marci gave \$150 budget, Gene will discuss the printer w/ Marci. CPC/PI- will present their budget by next meeting. Corrections- Christina doesn't feel the need to be sent to the Corrections Conference. No need for budget. Events- \$59 for sure that the budget needs to cover, Jessica anticipates 4 events for the year w/booking the Alano that the budget will need to cover, line item needed for dry goods, paper goods, ice tubs for food. Co-DCM's- Heather suggests budget for 2024 State Convention and SWRSA for both Co-DCM's to attend instead of just one. Next year Gene opposed having a budget to send DCM's going to State Convention unless they are speakers. No Groups or Districts fund sending DCM's to these events, GSR's/Groups just don't have the funds to send them, it would be out of pocket.
- Committee report for Spring 2024 Area10 Assembly updates- Dena has list of volunteers. First planning meeting on Sept 9th at 1:30 at the Alano Club. Dena also made a list of committees needed and sent an email w/a list of those committees for people to look over and sign up for where they would like to be involved. Dena encourages people to volunteer for chairs of those committees. Also included in the email is a flyer for the Assembly.
- Formation of Summer 2024 Area 10 Assembly Committee (discuss & vote for chair)-Heather standing for Chair. Motion made, 2nd, passed electing Heather as Chair for the 2024 Summer Assembly.
- District Inventory w/ past Delegate Scott M (discuss inventory questions)- Heather read through District Inventory Questions. Craig suggests limiting the amount of questions being asked. GSR's can go to their groups and ask which questions are really important.

Dena- how can we spend our time wisely. Jessica thinks there is a better way to get events publicized in a more effective way. Several groups are getting the announcements out in timely manner so they aren't being announced to much for to long. Discussed combining and eliminating Inventory questions. Patrick revising questions and will get in touch with Scott M about moving forward.

Treasurer (Gene) - Report for July - Motion made, 2nd, passed. District 2's July 2023 Treasurer's Report: CURRENT ACCOUNT STATUS: Checking Account: \$4,858.67 - Checking Account Balance as of July 31, 2023. Prudent Reserve Savings: \$1,000.57 - Current Savings Balance (Prudent Reserve) as of July 31, 2023. I've attached copies of PDF Documents including: ANB Bank Statement - Checking Account - 07312023 pdf District 2 - 2023 Group Contributions - 07312023.pdf District 2 - 2023 Expenses - 07312023.pdf District 2 - Budget to Actual Report - 07312023.pdf Group Contributions: District 2 received contributions from Oddballs and Original Clifton Group during July 2023. Total Group Contributions for July 2023 were \$105.36. Contributions during August have picked up with District 2 receiving contributions of \$34.60 from As Bill Sees It, \$198.64 from Lunch Bunch, \$36.93 from Odd Balls and \$407.00 from Tuesday Night Men's Group. I'm encouraged when I see a number of groups contribute as I've seen over the past 2 months. It means that groups believe in participating and funding District 2's efforts in reaching the still suffering alcoholic in our local area. Total Group Contributions collected to date (including August) is \$2,130.80 plus \$100.00 in contributions from the Gratitude Dinner that brings total contributions to \$2,230.80 for 2023 representing 45% of contributions budgeted in 2023 (\$5,000). With 4 months to go, District 2 is on pace to collect \$3,346.20 in contributions well below \$5,000 that was budgeted for 2023. Expenses: Expenses during July 2023 included \$16.08 for Zoom subscription, \$20.00 for CPC/PI Committee, \$54.34 for Treatment Committee and \$600 for Co-DCM's to travel to Area 10 Summer Assembly. Total expenses in July 2023 were \$690.42. Total expenses for the year is \$1,694.96 representing 34% of expenses budgeted in 2023 (\$5,000). As we discussed during July's District 2 meeting, all officers and Committee Chairs need to submit their estimated annual budget requirements in writing by the today's meeting. To date I have received budget requests from the Treatment Chair and Meeting Lists Chair. During our meeting today, I'll want to get input from DCM's, Officers and Committee Chairs on their budget requirements for 2024 and have those submitted in writing. I've printed and also attached copies of 2023 budget and proposed budget for 2024 with budget requests I've received to date to review. I'll compile budget requirements that are submitted and present the resulting preliminary budget at the September meeting. Line items we will be discussed and adjusted as necessary to match estimated income for 2024. Approval of the resulting overall preliminary budget should be accomplished at the October meeting, with a final budget to be presented by the Treasurer for official adoption by the November meeting.
